#### Dfe Updates Model Privacy Notices

#### What Has Changed?

• The Department for Education (DfE) has updated its model privacy notices for schools to provide to pupils, parents, governors and employees.

#### Summary of the Changes:

- The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) requires schools to provide certain information to data subjects about their personal data. This information is commonly provided in a privacy notice.
- The significant changes are as follows:
  - The list of suggested categories of pupil personal data has been expanded.
  - The DfE clarifies that a legal basis under Article 6 of GDPR should be named for each purpose of processing personal data. Where special category personal data (eg information about health, ethnicity, religious view and political opinions) is processed, then a legal condition from Article 9 should also be included in the notice.
  - It is a requirement to tell individuals for how long their information will be retained. A copy of this data retention policy is available within the Academy or alternatively you can email <a href="mailto:dataprotection@clf.education">dataprotection@clf.education</a>
  - The section on what rights individuals have in their personal data has been reworded and slightly expanded.

#### Impact on School Compliance Framework

• There are no new requirements placed on schools by these updated model privacy notices. That being said, the Cabot Learning Federation has in particular, reviewed its privacy notices to ensure they comply with the DfE's emphasis on listing a legal basis (or bases) for each purpose for processing personal data. This is a key requirement of such privacy notices.



## QUICK SETUP GUIDE

The SIMS Parent app allows us to easily communicate with you. the parent. Whether it's sharing information such as attendance. school reports or sending reminders for homework tasks, all of the information is easily accessible from the convenience of your phone, tablet or PC.

We can now easily send automated alerts and notifications directly to your phone! By sharing information on attendance, homework and timetables or school reports and conduct, you can stay on top of your child's progress. A clear dashboard gives you an overview of your child's school life and the data collection functionality within the app lets you easily update your contact information too.

Follow the steps below to setup and install the SIMS Parent App.



- We will send you an activation email. Simply click on the link inside the email from your tablet, PC or smartphone to activate your account.
- After clicking on the link in the email you will now be asked to login using your Facebook, Twitter, Google or Microsoft username and password.
- You will be asked the date of birth for one of your children at the school.
- Congratulations, you have registered for the SIMS Parent App. Now you just need to download the app!

\* The email will be from noreply@sims.co.uk so please check your SPAM or Junk folder if you cannot find it. If you still cannot find the email, please contact the school to confirm we have the correct contact information for you.

# Getting Started with Xpressions



If you've not already done so, install the Xpressions App.





Once you've installed the app, open it, enter your email address and click 'Next.'

All personal details will be taken from the school records, so the information you provide needs to match what they have on file. If you are unable to enter details successfully you will need to speak to your school office. If you are sure you have entered information correctly but you still see an error message, it is likely that the school records are incorrect so please contact your school.

Enter your mobile number and click 'Next.'

When you have entered details correctly you will receive a text message to your mobile phone containing a 6 digit code.

Enter this code and click 'Login.'

If you do not receive a code, use the 'Resend Code' function. However there can be delays due to mobile phone providers and other factors outside of the control of Xpressions and the school so please wait for at least 5 minutes and ensure you are in an area with mobile phone coverage.

Create a password (Recommended).

It is recommended that you create a password for your account at this stage. If you need to login again, or on another device, having a password will make the process easier. See our recommendations for a strong and secure password.

## WORK EXPERIENCE WEEK FOR YEAR 10

March 21st-24th was Work Experience Week for Year 10 students. The work experience process started back in November with a series of SPACE lessons focused on



researching and securing a work experience placement. This was followed by assemblies, careers meetings, letters home and newsletter articles all with the aim to secure quality work experience placements for all of our students. With the support of our SPACE teachers, careers lead, Jackie Fielding and parents and carers, over 190 of our Year 10 cohort managed to secure themselves work experience placements with almost 100 employers spread across the country and beyond. Placements ranged from local retail, service and educational roles to placements as far reaching as London, the Scottish Highlands and Romania. We had students working in independent businesses as well as big corporate chains in a number of different sectors.




The careers team spent the week visiting students on placements and students filled in work experience logs in Google Classroom to capture the skills and experience they gained throughout the week. The feedback from both students and employers has been overwhelmingly positive with a number offering paid part time work, training and further education opportunities or glowing references for future employment.



There are currently a large number of books which are overdue for return to the library. We do not charge fines for late books, but will ask that books are replaced if they are lost or not returned. Books need to be returned or replaced as part of the sign off for Year 11s to attend Prom.

Please check at home for any library books that need to be returned. They will have a Hans Price stamp along the side and a small white label on the spine. Library books can be dropped in the returns box on the library desk before or after school or at break or lunch.



This year we celebrated World Book day on Tuesday 7th March—a little later than expected. We understand the pressure dressing up can have on students so, as is fast Hans Price tradition, staff dressed up as book characters to entertain, inspire and intrigue our students. Throughout the day students used Character Hunt sheets to track down and



identify as many staff costumes as possible to be in the running for World Book Day Prizes! The winner identified over 60 costumes correctly!



Each student was also given a digital World Book Day token, explained as part of the Learning Family quiz, which can be exchanged for a free WBD book or £1 off a book of their choice in bookshops and supermarkets. The Home Office has launched a new online tool named StreetSafe to enable people, particularly women and girls, to help keep them safe on the streets.

The tool, which can be found at <a href="www.police.uk/streetsafe">www.police.uk/streetsafe</a> enables <a href="mailto:ALL">ALL</a> individuals to anonymously tell us about public locations where you have felt or feel unsafe and to identify the features that made you feel unsafe.

Features that could be reported using this service include environmental issues such as poor street lighting, vandalism and abandoned areas/buildings or if this is due to behaviours from other people; for example, being followed or verbally abused.


Police will then be able to use the logged information to work with partners to make improvements to unsafe areas, which could include responses such as increased street-lighting or extra patrols from police officers. The data collected through Street Safe will be completely anonymous and focuses on tackling the factors of particular locations that make people feel unsafe, therefore improving wellbeing and safety for communities.


Please note: 'StreetSafe' is not for reporting crime or incidents.

#### How can you make and maintain healthy relationships??

Communication: Talk and listen to each other. Be clear in what you

want to say. Actively listen and take an interest.

speak liste

Written online messages can be interpreted in a different manner to which they are meant. Consider how the other person will feel in receiving your message. It is ok to have a different opinion but be able to compromise in a calm manner.

listen Respect boundaries: Show understanding to each other. It is ok to say no to something you are not comfortable with. It is not ok to feel

pressured into feeling or behaving a certain way. You need to feel safe and ensure others feel safe in the relationship.

Trust and honesty: Be transparent from the beginning. Trust takes time to build. Always be honest — even if it is something the other person may not want to hear. Support others

when they are 'down' they will pay back this when you need some support. A good friend will be there for you through the good and the bad times.



It is healthy to do things with your other friends. You need to follow your own interests and be 'you' in your own right. Give yourself and your friends time to do things on their own or with other people.

Controlling behaviours, like being told what to wear, Always having to tell your partner where you are, Always having to tell your partner who you are with, Having your social media accounts checked, Feeling pressured into sexual activities, Being criticised privately or in front of peers, Being stopped from hanging out with friends, Always having to be what your partner decides, Being hurt, either physically or emotionally.
