

Tree Planting



A team of eager student environmentalists comprised of the academy's eco committee and a group of students from the Duke of Edinburgh programme in collaboration with the Woodland Trust, have planted 80 trees donated by the Trust. Trees planted include oak, birch, and willow, among others. This latest tree-planting initiative marks the third instalment, bringing the total number of trees planted through donations to an impressive 240.

The Woodland Trust is a leading environmental charity, aims to provide opportunities for tree planting across the UK. The charity's website says: "We aim to make sure everybody in the UK has the chance to plant a tree. So, we're giving away hundreds of thousands of trees to schools and communities. Together, we'll get millions more trees in the ground."

Dr Watts, Second in Science and Eco Coordinator, said: "The overarching goal of this initiative is to ensure that the trees planted will flourish. We hope these trees will be a firmly established by the time the students planting them are old enough to bring their children to Hans Price."





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Grey Kangaroo Maths

Following on from our successful UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge in January, we entered five Year 9 students for the Grey Kangaroo follow-on round in March. Only the top few thousand students in the country qualify for these rounds so these students did extremely well.

The students had to sit an hour long multiple choice paper consisting of 25 questions. An example question is shown below.

The diagram shows a smaller rectangle made from three squares, each of area 25 cm^2 , inside a larger rectangle. Two of the vertices of the smaller rectangle lie on the mid-points of the shorter sides of the larger rectangle. The other two vertices of the smaller rectangle lie on the other two sides of the larger rectangle. What is the area, in cm², of the larger rectangle?



The next trip is on Wednesday 1st May. The students will be taking part in a personality questionnaire about themselves, and then analysing it through activities at the Masonic Hall.











Child Employment



Employment for children under 16 years old, is closely regulated by the local authority. The Government provide clear guidelines regarding child employment, and as a school, we take a keen interest in our students' work engagements, as we play an active role in the permit approval process. All school-aged children need a work permit issued by the local authority, with employers being responsible for the application. This applies to all students until the last Friday in June of Year 11.



Restrictions on Child Employment

There are several restrictions on when and where children are allowed to work.

Children are allowed to work:

Term Time Rules

During term time children can only work a maximum of 12 hours a week. This includes:

- a maximum of 2 hours on school days and Sundays
- a maximum of 5 hours on Saturdays for 13 to 14-year-olds, or 8 hours for 15 to 16 -year-olds

School Holiday Rules

During school holidays 13 to 14-year-olds are only allowed to work a maximum of 25 hours a week. This includes:

 a maximum of 5 hours on weekdays and Saturdays

 a maximum of 2 hours on Sunday During school holidays 15 to 16-year-olds can only work a maximum of 35 hours a week. This includes:

- a maximum of 8 hours on weekdays and Saturdays
- a maximum of 2 hours on Sunday

Children are not allowed to work:

- without an employment permit issued by the education department of the local council, if this is required by local bylaws
- in places like a factory or industrial site during school hours
- before 7am or after 7pm
- for more than one hour before school (unless local bylaws allow it)
- for more than 4 hours without taking a break of at least 1 hour
- in any work that may be harmful to their health, well-being or education
- without having a 2-week break from any work during the school holidays in each calendar year

We support our students in pursuing employment, as it offers numerous developmental & educational benefits.

Sparx Maths



Every time a student completes a task, they earn Sparx Experience Points (XP). Students earn more XP if they complete XP Boost or Target homework tasks compared with their compulsory homework. Students reach a new level for every 10,000 XP they earn. They then receive a certificate and a badge to wear with pride on their blazer.
