Team Maths Challenge





For the first time, Hans Price Academy entered a team into the regional final of the UKMT Team Maths Challenge at the end of March.

The group consisted of 4 high achieving mathematicians. They were Kyati and Liam from Year 8 and Indie and Elliot from Year 9. They showed great commitment to this event by training after school for 4 weeks, practicing each round and getting to know each other as a group.

The students spent the day at Sidcot School, an independent school near Winscombe. The day consisted of 4 rounds of challenging questions in different formats. Some rounds needed an answer from one pair of students so that the other pair could use that answer to help them with their own questions. The relay round saw them running around, passing questions to each other to answer.

The team performed really well. After the first two rounds, they had scored 115 out of 116 points and were joint second out of 19 teams from a mix of independent and state schools. At the end of the event, they finished in 11th place overall. It is a very pleasing result for a first attempt at this competition.

The students represented HPA so well and should be proud of their achievement.

Grey Kangaroo Maths Challenge






In January, Hans Price Academy had one Year 9 student who achieved a Gold certificate, was Best in School, and qualified for the Grey Kangaroo follow-on round in March. Elliot C was one of only a few thousand students in the country to qualify for this round so he did really well to achieve this.

Elliot had to sit an hour long multiple choice paper consisting of 25 questions. An example question is shown below.

In the pentagon UVWXY, $\angle U = \angle V = 90^\circ$, UY = VW and YX = XW. Four equally spaced points are marked between U and V, and perpendiculars are drawn through each point, as shown in the diagram. The dark shaded region has an area of 13 cm^2 and the light shaded region has an area of 10 cm^2 .



What is the area, in cm², of the entire pentagon?

A 45

B 47

C 49

D 58

E 60

Elliot correctly answered 24 out of the 25 questions, earning him a Gold Kangaroo certificate. This is truly a very impressive score and a result of his hard work and dedication in preparing for the challenge.

Elliot is a remarkable mathematician. He also recently competed in the Team Maths Challenge at Sidcot School with 3 other students. He should be very proud of his achievements.

SPARX Maths





Every time a student completes their Sparx I.S, they earn Sparx Experience Points (XP). Students earn more XP if they complete XP Boost or Target homework tasks in addition to their compulsory independent study (homework). They can also earn more if they don't switch their questions to another one. (They are allowed up to 3 switches).

This year, Sparx have changed how often students level up. Students now reach a new Level for every 1,000 XP they earn.


