PINK KANGAROO MATHS CHALLENGE



Following on from our very successful UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge in January, Hans Price Academy had 7 students participate in the Pink Kangaroo follow-on round in March. Only a few thousand students in the country qualify for this round so they did really well to achieve this.

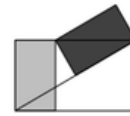
Those students were Archie H, Elijah M, Emma G, Jayden G, Ethan N, James F from Year 11, and Elliot C from Year 10.

Students had to sit an hour long multiple choice paper consisting of 25 questions. An example is shown below:

Maths Feasts are fun educational maths challenges for Year 10 students run throughout each region. They develop students' problem-solving and teamwork skills through engaging and challenging questions. Students worked in their groups completing different types of challenges, including a paired relay round, and estimating pi using Archimedes' method and Pythagoras' Theorem.

SCIENCE

Year 11 Next Steps and Guide to Post-16 Education

During Year 11, we have hosted Post-16 assemblies, delivered by a variety of external providers, to highlight the wide-ranging opportunities at Post-16 including College, Sixth Form and apprenticeship routes.

A Brief Guide to Post-16 Qualifications and Routes

‘T’ levels & BTECs: Ideal for students with one specific subject or vocational area in mind, with a practical and ‘hands on’ learning style and an emphasis on work experience. This is a mix of practical assignments and some exams. Equivalent to 3 A levels with routes into university, apprenticeships and the world of work.

‘A’ levels: Ideal for students who perform well in exams, enjoy the classroom environment and would like to study 3 or sometimes 4 subjects. For students with clear aspirations for university or those who do not have one specific subject area in mind and would like to keep their options open. Also, for routes into apprenticeships and the world of work.

Apprenticeships: Ideal for students who are looking to leave the classroom behind and enter the world of work. Apprenticeships are a full-time job with a day a week at college or assessment in the workplace.

Apprenticeships require a high level of maturity to apply for vacancies, be interviewed and secure a role.

Foundation learning: Foundation Learning is available at most colleges for students with special educational needs or disabilities (SEND) and barriers to learning.

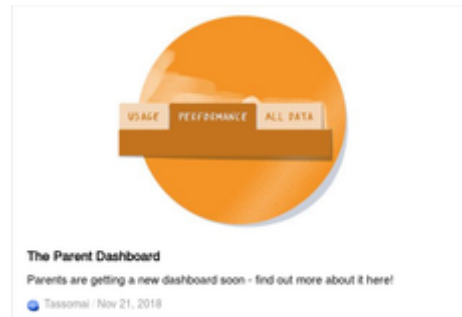

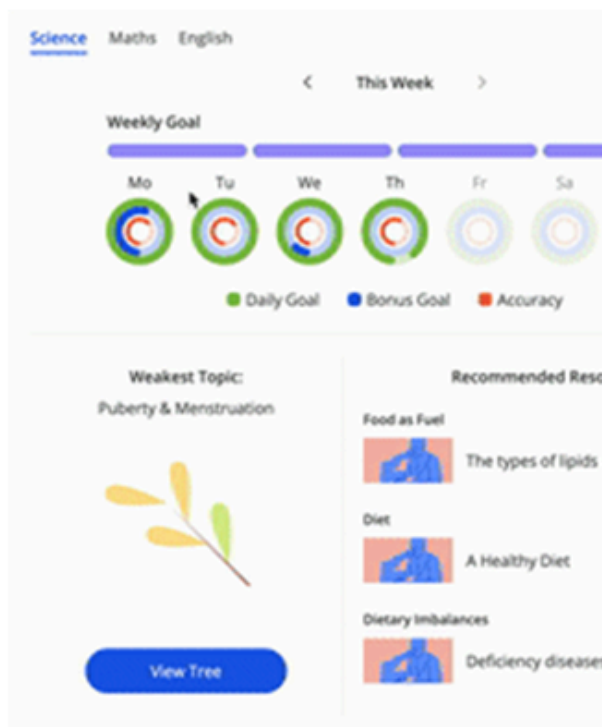

Mental Health Support Team (MHST)

Education Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs) work as part of the MHST in schools, helping them develop ways to look after the mental health and wellbeing of children and young people (CYP) as well as the wider school community, including school staff and parents/carers.

Just like physical health, we all have mental health, and need to learn tools to help ourselves through life's ups and downs.

Our logo is an otter because, like otters, we work as part of a team and we use tools! We want to share these tools with you so that you can look after your own wellbeing and build your resilience.



What's going on for you?



When we are struggling with difficult thoughts and feelings it can be helpful to talk to someone about where those feelings come from, and how to help ourselves feel better. That is where learning different tools to cope is useful.

What to Expect

Each school has an EMHP, who can help you learn these tools. In your first session, they will talk you through what to expect. Then you will have an assessment to find out more about what is going on for you. Then we decide together what support is best for you.

Some of our favourite tools are self-care, challenging negative thoughts, problem-solving, and managing worries. Learning these tools can improve our wellbeing and enjoyment of life.



What is LI-CBT?

The MHST offers early stage Low-Intensity Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (LI-CBT), usually lasting for 6 to 8 weeks.

LI-CBT is a type of **talking therapy** for mental health difficulties. We explore how your thoughts, feelings, physical sensations and behaviours are all linked together. We offer in-person 1-to-1 and group support for both CYP and parents/carers. We also have a growing online offer.



We support the **wider school community**, including school staff, classes and parents/carers. Look out for parent coffee mornings, workshops, resources and other ways to meet us.



Parenting village coffee morning



This is a relaxed and friendly drop-in session where parents and parenting specialists will be on hand to share resources, offer support, a listening ear or just spend time talking about what it's like to be a parent.

"It takes a village to raise a child" comes from an old African proverb. It shares the message that it takes many people to provide a safe and healthy environment in which children can flourish.

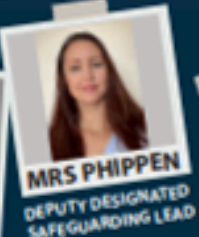
