GCHQ Christmas Challenge




Students across the year groups were given the opportunity in their maths lessons to have a go at solving this years GCHQ Christmas Challenge.

Every year, the GCHQ set the festive brainteaser for the public to have a go at solving and our students enjoyed taking part. They worked together as a team to solve the different problems, collaborating their ideas.



This year students had to decrypt the names of famous UK landmarks by using lateral thinking,





Some classes also learned about what the GCHQ does and what some of the jobs there entail. Some students also had a go at encrypting codes.

SPARX Maths





Every time a student completes their Sparx I.S, they earn Sparx Experience Points (XP). Students earn more XP if they complete XP Boost or Target homework tasks in addition to their compulsory independent study (homework). They can also earn more if they don't switch their questions to another one. (They are allowed up to 3 switches).

This year, Sparx have changed how often students level up. Students now reach a new Level for every 1,000 XP they earn.

Food Bank



Between the 5th and 18th of December was our annual food bank campaign, encouraging donations of any size to support families in need during the festive period.

The initiative launched in 2018 has seen over 4,000 essential items donated, including cereals, tinned soups, pasta, rice, pasta sauces and tinned meat and fish. These contributions will play a significant role in helping local families during what can be a challenging time of year. This year over 300 items were collected.

Weston Foodbank, a project established in 2011 by local churches and community groups, has been tirelessly working to combat hunger in the North Somerset area.

On its website, Weston Foodbank states: "Our foodbank is a project founded by local churches and community groups, working together towards stopping hunger in our local area and supported by North Somerset Council. The foodbank has collaborated with over 150 agencies, providing vital support to nearly 46,000 people since its inception.

Dr Andrew Watts, Second in Science and one of the organisers, said: "It's incredibly heartwarming to see the entire school community come together to support such an important cause. Every single donation, no matter how big or small, represents kindness and compassion, which truly embodies the spirit of the season. We're proud to play a part in making a difference for local families during Christmas."

Changes to Admission Policy



Consultation on the Draft Admissions Policies for Hans Price Academy 2026/27

Admissions authorities are required to consult on their admission arrangements whenever a change to the arrangements is proposed, or if no changes are proposed, every 7 years. As such the Cabot Learning Federation is consulting on the admissions arrangements for the above school, for students joining from September 2026.

The consultation period will run from 5th December 2024 to 24th January 2025.

Hans Price Academy is a Secondary Academy.

The academy is consulting on various changes including oversubscription criteria as well as updating wording to make Policies clear and relevant.


