# Sun Safety at HPA



At Hans Price Academy we take sun safety very seriously and want to remind students and staff to protect themselves from the suns harmful ultra-violet rays during the summer months. There are five simple rules to follow:



**Slip** on a protective clothing

**Slop** on Factor 50 sunscreen

**Slap** on a hat

**Slide** on some quality sunglasses



Seek out some shade



Sunscreen needs to be applied at home before the day starts but will also need to be re-applied during the morning and afternoon for it to be effective, especially if you are lucky enough to be splashing around in some warm seas or participating in water sports. Remember to apply correct coverage to all skin areas which are likely to be exposed to the sun. Most creams have a shelf life of around two years, so please check your expiry dates. When buying sunscreen, you will need to look for at least a sun protection factor (SPF) of 30 and a Ultraviolet Radiation (UV) of at least 4 star.

It is advised by the NHS to follow the sun protection rules of 'Slip, Slop, Slap, Slide and Seek' from 1<sup>st</sup> April until 30<sup>th</sup> October, even on cloudy days. You can check the UV forecast on a regular occasion for an indication of how strong the sun is predicted to be. Any UV levels higher than a level 3 will require protection.

45% of all UV skin damage occurs before the age of 20. You can burn in the UK even on cloudy days! Teenage Cancer Trust state that 'Skin cancer is the second most common cancer amongst young adults, getting painful sunburn twice a year can triple your chances of being diagnosed. Two young adults are diagnosed with skin cancer every day in the UK.'

We want you to be outdoors enjoying the fresh air during the summer months, but please do it in a safe manner and protect yourself from the sun and always keep yourself hydrated.

### Duke of Edinburgh Award

It's been another action-packed year for our cohort of DofE participants, in Bronze and Silver with both groups completing their expeditions.



Throughout the year they have been getting involved with a variety of activities to complete their sections including, sailing, coaching football, volunteering in charity shops and learning new languages.

In preparation for their expeditions, students undertook various training activities out of school. This involved learning how to use a Trangia to cook their own meals, basic first aid, map reading and route planning sessions. Learning elements of the countryside code was also an important aspect of the training.

Once the spring term started, the expedition training really began with the bronze award groups completing their practice walk. This was a great opportunity for the participants to put their learnt skills into practice. They all showed great

confidence and resilience while out on the Mendips and worked well as teams, despite moments of reluctance and uncertainty when presented with the unknown.

When the time arose for their assessed expedition, the teams pulled together to compose a route to cover 2 days, using their knowledge from the practice walk and training. There was a real positive vibe when they all reached camp, despite a couple of detours from routes and they all made it in safe and sound. Day 2 presented them with a flatter route, but it wasn't without its challenges. However, after the confidence built up on day, the teams were able to overcome these quickly and the majority were able to complete their expedition successfully.



As for the Silver groups, their expedition training kicked off late in the Spring term with a 2-day, 2-night practice expedition over Exmoor. All the Silver participants had already completed their bronze expeditions and so felt confident with their route planning and their map reading skills. This was evident in their decision making and pace throughout the walks. The competitiveness wasn't wasted at the campsite with a football game against the Broadoak Academy participants. Although the Silver practice was longer and tougher, spirits remained high whilst planning their 3-day, 2 night assessed expedition. The participants created some fabulous routes which led them over the Quantock hills, offering some amazing views of the countryside and Southwest coast.

All in all, a very successful expedition season, resulting in some great memories for the participants.

If your child is interested in taking part in the Duke of Edinburgh award, enrolment forms will be available for Year 9s (Bronze) and 10s (Silver) ready to start in Term 2.



## **Uniform - High Expectations**

### Jewellery and make up

Students may choose to wear:

- A watch. Smart watches, including Apple watches are not allowed.
- · A pair of small sleepers or stud earrings (one in each ear) in the ear lobe only.
- One ring and one small pendant—which must not be visible and must be able to be removed for PE.
- A small, plain silver, gold or clear plastic nose stud. This must be removed for PE.
- Further facial piercings, including but not limited to nose rings, septum rings, tongue piercings, are not allowed.
- · Make up should be minimal and natural looking. False eyelashes are not allowed.
- · False nails and/or nail extensions are not allowed.

We ask parents to note that <u>all</u> jewellery must be removed for PE. This includes instances where a child has recently pierced their ears/nose. We recommend that any new piercings are carried out at the start of the school summer holidays to allow the recommended sixweek healing process.

### Hair Colour

Our Hans Price uniform is intended to replicate formal business attire. In keeping with this, we expect students to have natural hair colours as would be expected of someone working in a formal workplace environment. Two-tone hair colours are not allowed. Unnatural hair colours (e.g. pink, blue) are not allowed.

Hans Price Academy has adopted The Halo Code which explicitly protects students and staff who come to school with natural hair and protective hairstyles associated with their racial, ethnic and cultural identities.

### The Halo Code

Our school champions the right of staff and students to embrace all Afro-hairstyles. We acknowledge that Afro-textured hair is an important part of our Black staff and students' racial, ethnic, cultural and religious identities, and requires specific styling for hair health and maintenance.

At this school we recognise and celebrate our staff and students' identities. We are a community built on the ethos of equality and respect where hair texture and style have no bearing on anyone's ability to succeed.

If a student arrives at school with incorrect uniform, their College Leader or a member of the Senior Leadership Team may:

- a. Provide a change of uniform
- b. Send the student home to correct the uniform, having first contacted the parents/carers
- c. Send the student to R5 to work for the day.

The Principal's decision on acceptable uniform is final.



### Dfe Updates Model Privacy Notices

### What Has Changed?

• The Department for Education (DfE) has updated its model privacy notices for schools to provide to pupils, parents, governors and employees.


### Summary of the Changes:

- The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) requires schools to provide certain information to data subjects about their personal data. This information is commonly provided in a privacy notice.
- The significant changes are as follows:
  - The list of suggested categories of pupil personal data has been expanded.
  - The DfE clarifies that a legal basis under Article 6 of GDPR should be named for each purpose of processing personal data. Where special category personal data (eg information about health, ethnicity, religious view and political opinions) is processed, then a legal condition from Article 9 should also be included in the notice.
  - It is a requirement to tell individuals for how long their information will be retained. A copy of this data retention policy is available within the Academy or alternatively you can email <u>dataprotection@clf.education</u>
  - The section on what rights individuals have in their personal data has been reworded and slightly expanded.

### Impact on School Compliance Framework

There are no new requirements placed on schools by these updated model privacy notices. That being said, the Cabot Learning Federation has in particular, reviewed its privacy notices to ensure they comply with the DfE's emphasis on listing a legal basis (or bases) for each purpose for processing personal data. This is a key requirement of such privacy notices.

### Junior Maths Challenge

In April, the Maths Department entered 110 top mathematicians from Years 7 and 8 into the Junior Maths Challenge and achieved impressive results.



The challenge is run by the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust and consists of answering 25 multiple choice questions in an hour. The questions test students' logical thinking, ability to problem solve and extends their understanding of mathematical ideas covered in their maths lessons.

Students worked really hard to prepare for it and enjoyed competing. Between them, they managed to achieve 3 Gold, 17 Silver and 34 Bronze certificates. Everyone else received a participation certificate.

Two presentation sessions were put on to award the certificates and find out who won Best in Year and Best in School. Best in Year was jointly won by Elliot C, Zarina N and Kamil K from Year 7 by achieving the highest scoring Silver award. 3 students from Year 8 were awarded the Gold award. They were Archie H, Brendan D and Emma G. Our Best in School winner was Emma with the highest scoring Gold award.

# **Railway Line Safety**

From special journeys to everyday commutes, the rail network helps get us where we need to be. Even if we're not travelling, the railway is switched on 24/7 and we need to be switched on to the risks the rail environment can pose. There are 20,000 miles of track, 30,000 bridges, tunnels and viaducts plus thousands of signals, level crossings and stations across our rail network.

There are more than 13,000 trespass incidents on the tracks every year. The railway lines that run through the Weston area have multiple level crossings. The only safe time to drive over a level crossing is when the alarm has stopped sounding and the barriers are fully raised. It is illegal and dangerous to cross the tracks when the barriers are down. You could get seriously harmed and potentially electrically shocked, and even though it appears that a train isn't in sight that could change quickly.

Throwing obstructions onto the line is also illegal and highly dangerous. Although this may seem like a bit of harmless fun it can have serious consequences. From causing severe delays to people's journeys to potentially causing a very serious train accident. It's also likely that this dangerous behaviour will be caught on CCTV, which could mean a fine or a custodial sentence.



### Do you know your Railway safety signs?



This is an advanced warning, instructing level crossing users, including emergency vehicles, that they must stop when the lights show as a train is due to pass over the crossing.



You can't go further than this sign as it could be dangerous.

You must pay attention to the lights. Stop means a train is on its way. You should wait for the light to turn green before crossing the tracks. You will see this sign at some footpath or bridleway level crossings or private vehicle crossings.





A phone is nearby to use in case of emergency, and also to obtain permission to cross. At a level crossing. But be aware that if there isn't an emergency phone, there will always be a number you can call in an emergency.

The signs will tell you if you need to phone.



This indicates that there is a level crossing ahead that uses either automatic barriers or gates operated manually by railway staff.



That the level crossing in front of you does not have a barrier or gates. You must Stop, Look and Listen in order to ensure it is safe to cross the tracks. At a level crossing where there is no barrier. These types of level crossings are usually found in rural areas where cars have to give way to trains.

This is a reminder that trains don't always sound their horns as they approach level crossings and only do so if you're too far out to be able to see.
