Junior Maths Challenge



In April, 101 top mathematicians from Years 7 and 8 took part in the Junior Maths Challenge and achieved impressive results.

The challenge is run by the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust and consists of answering 25 multiple choice questions in an hour. The questions test students' logical thinking, ability to problem solve and extends their understanding of mathematical ideas covered in their maths lessons. Students worked hard to prepare for it and enjoyed competing.



The top 50% of all students nationally achieve either a Bronze, Silver or Gold certificate. Between them, our students achieved 4 Gold, 17 Silver and 33 Bronze certificates. To achieve a Gold certificate, students had to be in the top 8% of all participants, so this is an incredible achievement for them. Everyone else received a participation certificate.

We also had 2 students, Elliot and Indie, who qualified for the follow-on round in June – the Junior Kangaroo. This is an amazing achievement and a first for Hans Price in recent years. We will also be inviting a few more students to take part in this round if their scores were high. Well done to all involved.

Sun Safety





At Hans Price Academy we take sun safety very seriously and want to remind students and staff to protect themselves from the suns harmful ultra-violet rays during the summer months. There are five simple rules to follow:

Slip on protective clothing

Slop on Factor 50 sunscreen

Slap on a hat



Slide on some quality sunglasses

Seek out some shade



Sunscreen needs to be applied at home before the day starts but will also need to be re-applied during the morning and afternoon for it to be effective, especially if you are lucky enough to be splashing around in some warm seas or participating in water sports. Remember to apply correct coverage to all skin areas which are likely to be exposed to the sun. Most creams have a shelf life of around two years, so please check your expiry dates. When buying sunscreen, you will need to look for at least a sun protection factor (SPF) of 30 and a Ultraviolet Radiation (UV) of at least 4 star.

It is advised by the NHS to follow the sun protection rules of 'Slip, Slop, Slap, Slide and Seek' from 1st April until 30th October, even on cloudy days. You can check the UV forecast on a regular occasion for an indication of how strong the sun is predicted to be. Any UV levels higher than a level 3 will require protection.

45% of all UV skin damage occurs before the age of 20. You can burn in the UK even on cloudy

days! Teenage Cancer Trust state that 'Skin cancer is the second most common cancer amongst young adults, getting painful sunburn twice a year can triple your chances of being diagnosed. Two young adults are diagnosed with skin cancer every day in the UK.'























CLF Big Walk



The CLF Big Walk took place on Sunday 19th May. Over 100 colleagues across the trust walked to raise money for students in the CLF.

Staff (and Hanson) from HPA walked nearly 10 miles from Uphill to Brean and back again!

At Hans Price Academy we are passionate about supporting mental health for our young people. Mental Health Awareness week was a fabulous opportunity to showcase what we offer and to raise further awareness.



As the theme for the week was "Move it for Mental Health" we arranged a variety of activities for students and staff. For our Year 11 students the amazing Miss Worrall organised an exam stress workshop. We invited our close external agencies and mental health providers Kooth and Off The Record to set up pop up stands during lunch to talk about strategies and how they can support. Further to this, we had a lovely presentation in Learning Family from one of our Counsellors, Alex Gaulton (he also evidenced his football skills during Wednesday's lunch!), an

interactive quiz from Mr Hartley and hula hooping fun whole school assembly from Mrs Collis. At the end of the week we had the return of the photobooth - green themed of course!

We also spread awareness amongst our staff team. This included a Mental Health Awareness briefing with cakes and appreciation cards that could be written and given to other staff members and wearing green on Friday. We also raised money for our internal Social, Emotional and Mental Health team by selling Mental Health Awareness badges to staff. From the badges we were able to raise £52.21.

Library News





Accelerated Reader is the system we use to encourage, track and reward reading at Hans Price Academy in Years 7 and 8. When students finish a book they log into their account and take a short quiz on the book. This tracks the books they read, indicates understanding and calculates their word count.

The Reading Cup is a big part of the college competition with points available for highest word count and successful quizzes on finished books.

There are also achievement badges for students who read over one million words or pass over fifty quizzes. Our Word Millionaires and Gold Level Quizzers can wear these badges on their blazers and receive bonus points for the College Cup.

Our Year 7 and 8 students have read more this year than in any previous years with the current word count in Accelerated Reader passing 100,000,000 for the first time — and it's only Term 5!

BOOK RETURNS

Sparx Maths



Every time a student completes a task, they earn **Sparx Experience Points** (XP). Students earn more XP if they complete XP Boost or Target homework tasks compared with their **compulsory** homework. **Students reach a new Level for every 10,000 XP they earn.** They then receive a certificate and a badge to wear with pride on their blazer.
