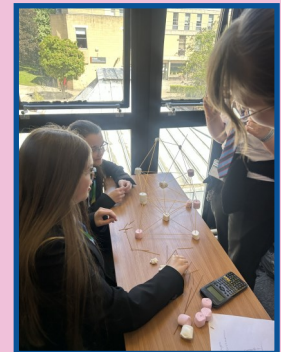
# Bath University Trip

Staff have put their best feet forward as they embarked on their very own Big Walk, raising vital funds to support this year's 'Big Trip'.

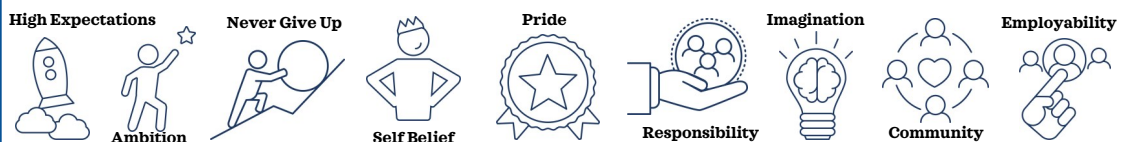

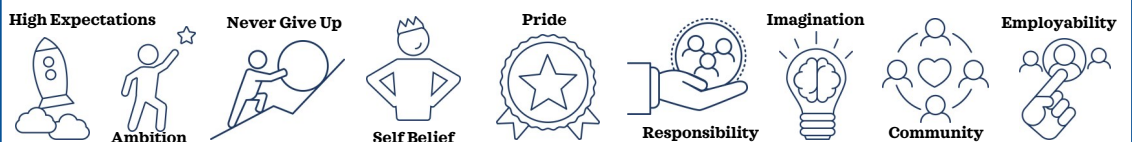
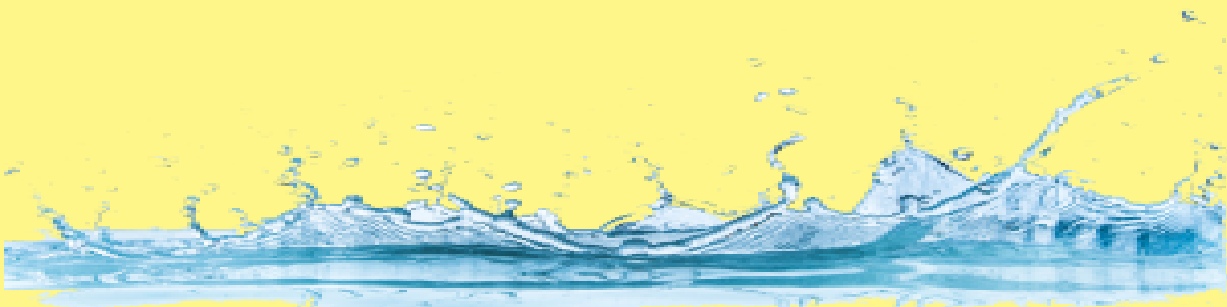
The Hans Price outing was the first team event in this year's CLF Big Walk and Big Run schedule, with a host more set to take place during May.

Year 7 and 8 spectators created a brilliant atmosphere and conducted themselves perfectly. Well done to everyone involved.



# Junior Maths Challenge



On 1st May, 125 top mathematicians from Years 7 and 8 took part in the Junior Maths Challenge and achieved impressive results.

The challenge is run by the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust and consists of answering 25 multiple choice questions in one hour. The questions test students logical thinking, ability to problem solve and extends their understanding of mathematical ideas covered in their maths lessons. Students worked hard to prepare for it and enjoyed competing.

The top 50% of all students nationally achieve either a Bronze, Silver or Gold certificate. 55% of our students achieved certificates - 5 Gold, 24 Silver and 40 Bronze. To achieve a Gold certificate, students had to be in the top 8% of all participants, so this is an incredible achievement for them. Everyone else received a participation certificate.

The 5 students who achieved Gold are also going through to the follow-on round in June – the Junior Kangaroo. This is an amazing outcome and they should be proud of their efforts.

# Space Mission

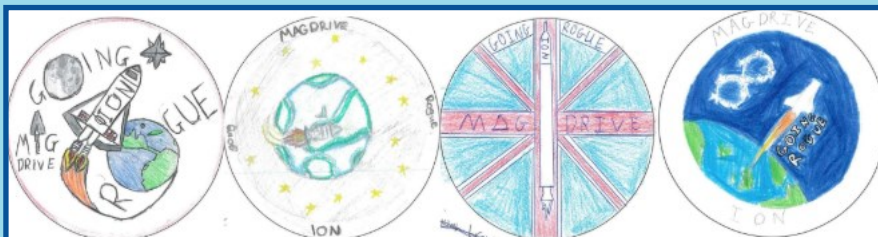
## Will Your Work Go To Space?

# SPARX Maths



Every time a student completes their Sparx I.S, they earn Sparx Experience Points (XP). Students earn more XP if they complete XP Boost or Target homework tasks in addition to their compulsory independent study (homework). They can also earn more if they don't switch their questions to another one. (They are allowed up to 3 switches).

This year, Sparx have changed how often students level up. Students now reach a new Level for every 1,000 XP they earn.
