Students have been celebrating Sir David Attenborough's 100th birthday through a range of activities across our curriculum.

Year 7 students went hunting with some dangerous predators as they entered the natural world through a VR experience.

Reo and Jess in Year 7 said:

"During our science lesson last week, we were visited by a VR company. Through our headsets we were transported to the jungle, the ocean, the skies and the grasslands of planet Earth. Some of the species we found were the tree frog, the viper, the rabbit and the eagle, and we learned how each were adapted to their habitat. Our favourite part was watching the tiger track and pounce on the deer. It was tense but exciting! It was great to experience lots of habitats just like Sir David Attenborough has, and help celebrate his 100th birthday!"





Year 8 students planted 100 bulbs which were kindly donated by one of our local garden centres (Hutton Garden Centre).



Year 9 students baked 100 birthday celebration cupcakes. These were then sold to raise £100 which will be donated to Secret World Wildlife Rescue.

Students across KS3 have put themselves in Sir David Attenborough's shoes, writing a dialogue for a muted nature clip. Other students sketched Aztec themed wildlife in Art, took part in a 100 species scavenger hunt across the Academy site and some students even had their birthday card design sent to Sir David Attenborough himself.



The week culminated in all students in Year 7 through to Year 10 taking part in The Big Watch. Students were transported to the natural world, captivated by David Attenborough's narration of Our Planet.

Charli, Kobi, Cieran, Alice and Syd have said:

"Friday afternoon was a little different to normal: we took part in the Big Watch! This meant that during our normal lessons, we engaged with some of Attenborough's most famous documentaries and learned about how species around the world are adapted to the habitats in which they live. We saw the spider monkey avoiding predators in the jungle, flamingos tolerating harsh drought conditions, and manakins dancing for their mates. It was an amazing opportunity for all students to engage with and understand the importance of conserving our planet. 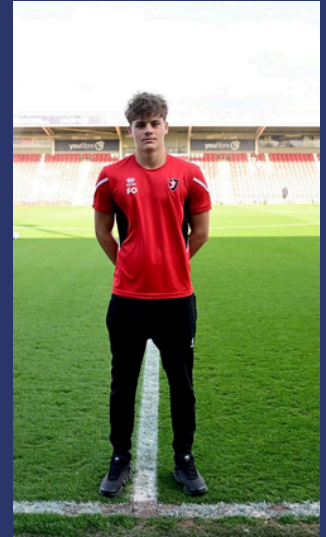

We are incredibly proud to share that Year 11 student, Freddie has been offered a two year fully funded scholarship at Cheltenham Football Club.

Freddie began playing football for several local junior clubs, later joining Weston-super-Mare AFC, where he captained the side to being JPL NPC South West Champions. On a Sunday, he would play for grass roots team Brislington winning the League twice, League Cup once and County Cup twice all while remaining unbeaten. He later moved on to North Somerset where he won the JPL Premier South West League. His performance in a 3-0 win over Gloucester caught the attention of a scout, leading to an exciting opportunity with Cheltenham Town. Since then, he has played against Wolves in a cup final at Birmingham, featured in a U18 PDL qualifier where they beat Stockport 1-0 and scored against Bournemouth in a cup competition.



As part of the programme, Freddie will play U18s football for Cheltenham FC while also studying Sport alongside his football development; supporting both his academic and athletic progression.

Junior Maths Challenge

At the end of April, 126 top mathematicians from Years 7 and 8 took part in the Junior Maths Challenge and achieved impressive results.

The Challenge is run by the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust and consists of answering 25 multiple choice questions in an hour. The questions test students' logical thinking, ability to problem solve and extend their understanding of mathematical ideas covered in their maths lessons. Students worked hard to prepare for it and enjoyed competing.

The top 50% of all students nationally achieve either a Bronze, Silver or Gold certificate. Exactly 50% of our students achieved certificates - 10 Gold, 21 Silver and 32 Bronze. This is a record amount of Golds for Hans Price. To achieve a Gold certificate, students had to be in the top 8% of all participants, so this is an incredible achievement for them.

6 students who achieved Gold also qualified to go through to the follow-on round in June – the Junior Kangaroo. They needed to score 80+ to qualify. This is an amazing outcome and they should be proud of their efforts. We will however, be inviting all our Gold winners to participate.

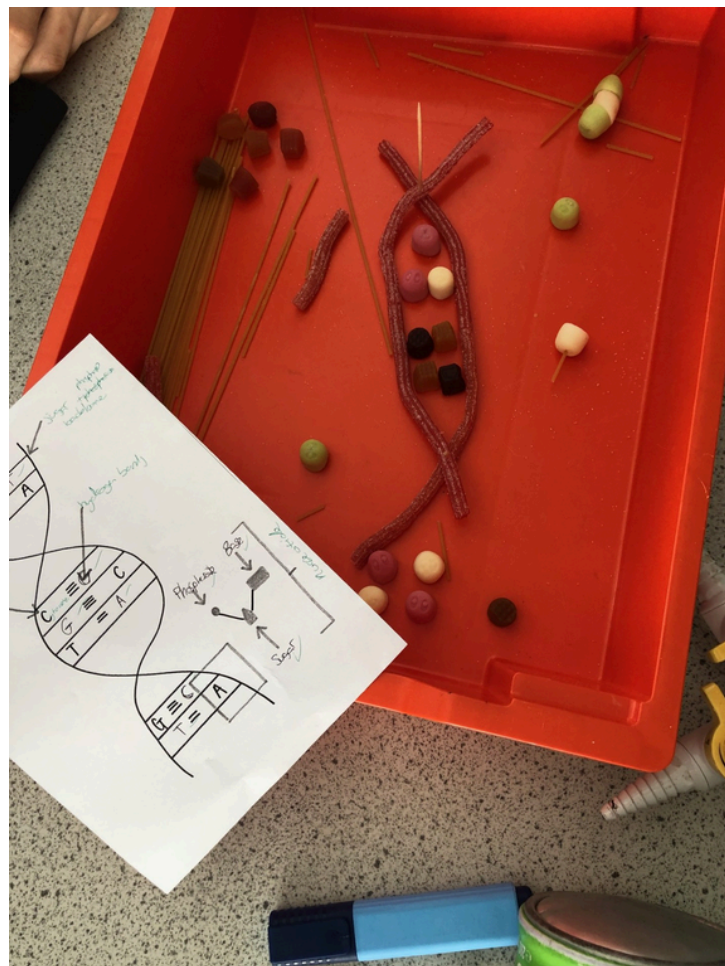
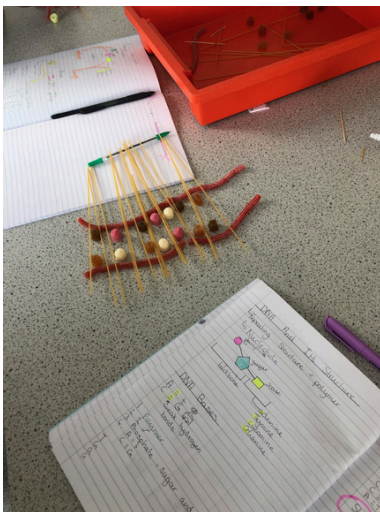


DNA

Year 11 Next Steps and Guide to Post-16 Education

As an Academy, we continue to support all Year 11 students to prepare for their next steps and Post-16 choices. During Year 11, we have hosted Post-16 assemblies, delivered by a variety of external providers, to highlight the wide-ranging opportunities at Post-16 including College, Sixth Form and Apprenticeship routes.

Every student in Year 11 has received a 1:1 career guidance session with myself, Jackie Fielding, Careers Adviser, to prepare for Post-16 applications. As an Academy we can support students with their applications where needed.

A Brief Guide to Post-16 Qualifications and Routes

‘T’ levels & BTECs: Ideal for students with one specific subject or vocational area in mind, with a practical and ‘hands on’ learning style and an emphasis on work experience. This is a mix of practical assignments and some exams. Equivalent to 3 A levels with routes into university, apprenticeships and the world of work.

‘A’ levels: Ideal for students who perform well in exams, enjoy the classroom environment and would like to study 3 or sometimes 4 subjects. For students with clear aspirations for university or those who do not have one specific subject area in mind and would like to keep their options open. Also, for routes into apprenticeships and the world of work.

Apprenticeships: Ideal for students who are looking to leave the classroom behind and enter the world of work. Apprenticeships are a full-time job with a day a week at college or assessment in the workplace.

Apprenticeships require a high level of maturity to apply for vacancies, be interviewed and secure a role.

Foundation Learning: Foundation Learning is available at most colleges for students with special educational needs or disabilities (SEND) and barriers to learning.
