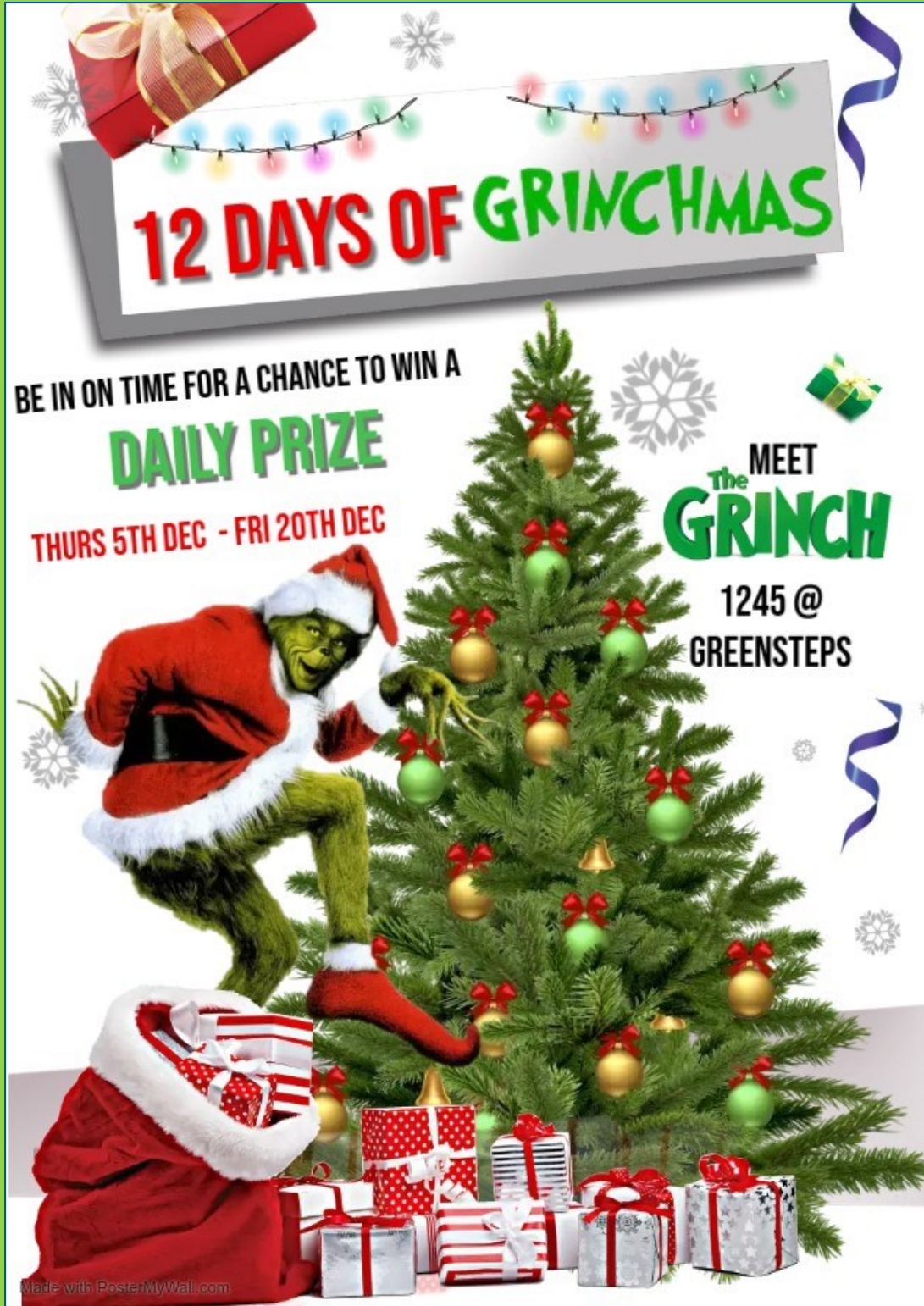

During October half term Carys has been performing at The Playhouse with the Weston Operatic Society in Joseph and his amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat.

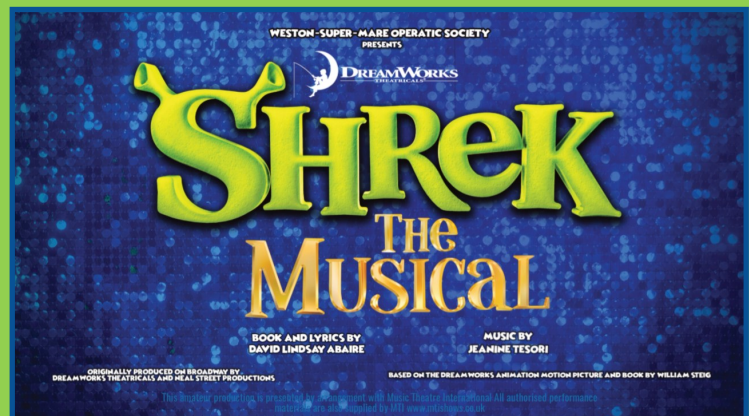
She has been rehearsing since May and during the run of the production Carys has been on stage 5 out of 7 days. The show has had fantastic reviews and everyone is so proud of her.

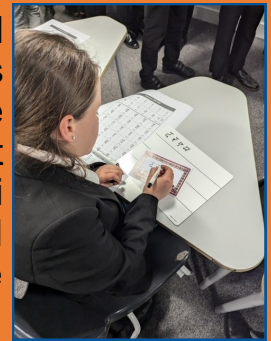

Armistice Day



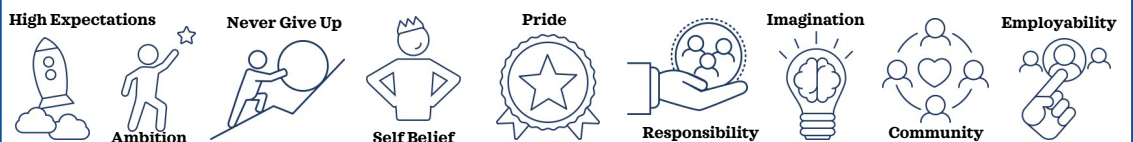
Staff and students joined the nation in observing a two-minute silence to honour Armistice Day (November 11).

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SPARX



Every time a student completes their Sparx I.S, they earn Sparx Experience Points (XP). Students earn more XP if they complete XP Boost or Target homework tasks in addition to their compulsory independent study (homework). They can also earn more if they don't switch their questions to another one. (They are allowed up to 3 switches).

This year, Sparx have changed how often students level up. Students now reach a new Level for every 1,000 XP they earn.

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Consent & Digital Images



In the ever-evolving digital world, where sharing photos and videos online has become as natural as breathing, it's essential for parents to teach their children about consent. Consent in the context of digital images means giving or receiving permission before an image is shared. It's not just a digital etiquette; it's about respect, privacy, and self-awareness.

What Does Consent Mean for Children?

Consent is like asking before you borrow a friend's pencil or sharing a secret. It's simple respect. Before posting a photo of a friend or even a family member, they should ask, "Is it okay if I share this?"

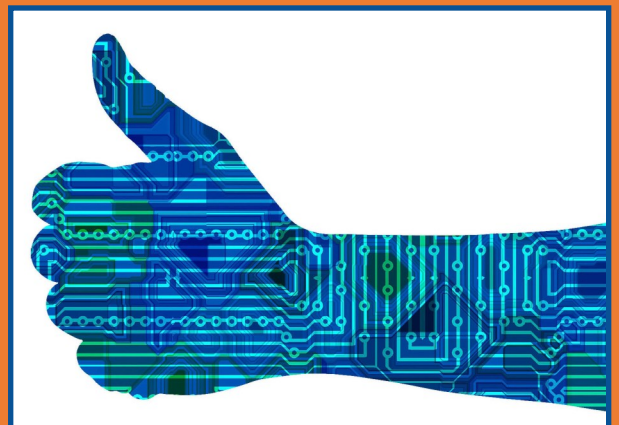
Why Teaching Consent is Crucial:

- **Privacy Protection:** Without consent, sharing photos can lead to privacy breaches.
- **Preventing Harm:** Images can be misused, leading to cyberbullying or even more severe issues like identity theft.
- **Respect for Others:** It's a lesson in empathy and respect, mirroring real-world interactions.

How to Teach Consent:

- **Lead by Example:** Show your children how you ask for their consent before posting their photos online. This sets a clear standard for behaviour.
- **Explain Digital Footprints:** Use simple language to explain that once an image is online, it's there forever. Encourage them to think about the long-term impact of what they share.
- **Set Family Guidelines:** Introduce rules like always asking for permission before sharing images of others or even themselves. This could be a family discussion, making it a collective decision.
- **Role-Playing:** Create scenarios where your child has to decide whether to share an image. Ask them how they would feel in someone else's shoes.

Teaching consent with digital images isn't just about safety; it's about empowering children to navigate the digital world with confidence and respect. It's about planting seeds for ethical behaviour that will grow with them. By understanding and valuing consent, children learn to respect boundaries, both their own and those of others, making the internet not just a tool, but a community where everyone feels safe and respected. Remember, consent is a two-way street - it's about giving as much as it is about receiving.



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Library News



Reading is a huge part of the culture at Hans Price Academy. The library is open before school, at breaktime and at lunchtime. All students automatically have a library account and can borrow books to read in school and at home. Students have a dedicated reading lesson every week in the library but are also expected to dedicate time to reading outside lesson time.

Accelerated Reader is the system we use to encourage, track and reward reading in Years 7 and 8. When students finish a book they log into their account and take a short quiz on the book. This tracks the books they read, indicates understanding and calculates their word count.

Any items left at the end of term will be taken to the charity shop.

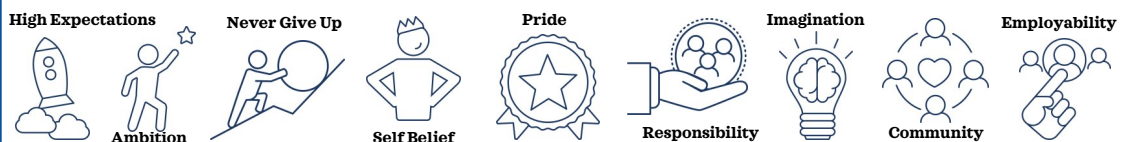


Exam Invigilators

Purple Chair Project



The 'Purple Chair Scheme' provides a safe space for women and girls to access information about health and wellbeing, as well as support and resources available to them in whatever circumstances they find themselves in. This may be when someone is experiencing domestic or racial abuse, or addiction issues.

Purple chairs and information packs can be found in the following libraries across North Somerset: Clevedon, Pill, Portishead, Winscombe, Worle, Weston-super-Mare (For All Healthy Living Centre, The Campus and Weston Central Library) and Yatton. An information pack can also be found in Nailsea library and on the council's mobile library.
