Mental Health Week




<u>Hello Yellow - Bethany W, Clarus 10</u>

Year 10 Work Experience 2024



Year 10 students will complete a work experience placement from Tuesday 19th -Friday 22nd March 2024. Placements will need to be secured by January to ensure enough time to complete the necessary Health and Safety checks.

Successful placements usually come from telephone enquiries, face to face visits or personal connections. The Christmas break is a great time to visit employers or reach out to contacts. Once an employer has agreed to a work experience placement they will need to complete a blue WEX form. These forms are available at the careers office and capture the necessary company details and provide an agreement between the employer, student and parents/carers. The form must then be returned to Hans Price Reception or the Careers Office (please feel free to make a copy for reference).

Every student is expected to complete work experience and they will get far more from the experience by choosing and securing their own placement. We do have a small database previously checked and approved placements to support any students who were unable to secure their own.

Well done to everyone who has already secured their placement for March! Here are some examples of Year 10s who took the initiative and found their own work experience placement:

Joshua " My mum works there; she asked them, and they asked me to send an email and they said yes"

Lara "I sent an email to the school; they said yes then I took the form in."

Jamie - "Mum works there they asked for a CV, they said yes."


Aimee " I called in and asked them if they would take me for work experience, they said yes, I gave them the form."



Every time a student completes a task or wins a minigame, they earn **Sparx Experience Points** (XP). Questions from different homework types earn students different numbers of points. For example, students earn more XP if they can complete XP Boost or Target homework tasks compared with their **Compulsory** homework tasks. This is because we want to reward them for going above and beyond. Students reach a new Level for every 10,000 XP they earn. They then receive a certificate and a badge to wear with pride on their blazer - Mrs Morris


Year 11 Careers Events

Keeping safe in the Community

Dear Hans Price Students,

We know many of you like to meet up with your friends outside of school. We would like you to think about ways to keep yourself safe as the evenings are getting darker and colder.

We would like to suggest the following points:

- 1. Make sure a parent / carer knows where you are going and who you are with.
- 2. Agree a timescale for returning home and stick to it.
- 3. Always have your phone charged up in case you need to call home, or you have an emergency.
- 4. If your plans change make sure your parents / carers know.
- 5. Public transport is safe to use, make sure you know the timetables and have the money for the fares.
- 6. Organised clubs are good to attend, you can build up skills and make friends with similar interests.

Anti-social behaviour in the community:

- If peers, try to encourage you to do something you know is wrong – be prepared to say no and walk away from situations. This could include shop lifting, causing criminal damage or being disrespectful. All of these could lead to police involvement and a criminal record for life.
- 2. Remember your online presence can be tracked so keep messages kind and respectful. Large group chats are frequently the cause of lots of dramas between teens.
- 3. Know your legal age limits you have to be over 18 years for vaping, smoking and drinking alcohol.

Please take care of yourselves and each other and continue to make your families and Hans Price Academy proud.


