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
Black History Month

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Talent Show





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
Year 10 Scientists flying high on Tassomai




Year 8 Rugby Tournament

SPARX Maths





Every time a student completes their Sparx I.S, they earn Sparx Experience Points (XP). Students earn more XP if they complete XP Boost or Target homework tasks in addition to their compulsory homework. They can also earn more if they don't switch their questions to another one. (They are allowed up to 3 switches).

This year, Sparx have changed how often students level up. Students now reach a new Level for every 1,000 XP they earn.

We won't be issuing a certificate every time they reach 1,000 XP. Instead, students will receive a certificate when they reach a milestone amount of XP. Badges will also be issued at various milestone amounts.

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Year 10 Work Experience



All Year 10 students will complete a work experience placement from Monday 14th - Friday 19th March 2025.

The aim is for students to secure placements before we break up in December. This allows adequate time for Health and Safety checks to be completed for businesses and work environments we have not had placements with before. It also avoids competition with other schools in the local area.

What will WEX Week Involve?

- WEX will be completed Monday 10th March Friday 14th March
- Placements should be secured before Friday 20th December
- Employability Day later in the year

Next Steps:

- Research and explore WEX ideas. Reach out to contacts, send emails or draft a letter in SPACE lessons. Call or visit employers to confirm placements.
- Collect, complete and deliver a WEX form to the employer.
- Return the completed form to reception or Mrs Fielding in the Careers Office.

Library News



Reading is a huge part of the culture at Hans Price Academy. The library is open before school, at breaktime and at lunchtime. All students automatically have a library account and can borrow books to read in school and at home. Students have a dedicated reading lesson every week in the library but are also expected to dedicate time to reading outside lesson time.



Accelerated Reader is the system we use to encourage, track and reward reading in Years 7 and 8. When students finish a book they log into their account and take a short guiz on the book. This

tracks the books they read, indicates understanding and calculates their word count.




Year 11 Post-16 Events



We continue to support families with post-16 applications and ensure that our students have access to up-to-date and relevant information to inform their choices. During Year 11 every child will receive a 1:1 careers advice session. We host post-16 assemblies from a variety of providers promoting a range of options including College, Sixth Form and apprenticeship routes.

We can support students with their applications, but we strongly recommend families attend open day events in the community for their top choice selections. As a guide, all students in Year 11 should have made 3 applications to post-16 providers by the Christmas holidays.

The HPA admin team got their baking hats on this month, selling cakes to raise money for the Breast Cancer Now research charity. The total raised was £364!



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
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
