Subject(s)	Go to...	Extra information
English	Google Classroom	Complete your <i>Tassomai Weekly Goal</i> and then complete the task on Google Classroom. Complete tasks in your revision guide.
Science	Your teacher, in person or by email	Email or speak to your teacher, asking what you need to focus on for your catch-up work. They will let you know the task you need to complete.
Maths	Dr Frost or Sparx	Sparx: Complete the XP Boost questions and Target questions from your latest homework tasks. Use the videos provided for extra support. Additional questions are in the Independent Learning section, by searching the last topic covered in class. Dr Frost: Search your recent topic covered in class and completed the questions given. Videos are available for additional support.

PSHE	Google Classroom	Complete the latest activity on Google Classroom. Email your teacher to check.

English	Google Classroom	Complete the work for the date you were absent found on Google Classroom. Email your teacher if you need a code to access Google Classroom.
Maths	Sparx	Complete the XP Boost questions and Target questions from your latest homework tasks. Use the videos provided for extra support. Additional questions are in the Independent Learning section, by searching the last topic covered in class.
Science, Technology, Geography, History & RWV	Your teacher, by email or in person	Email or speak to your teacher, asking what you need to focus on for your catch-up work. They will let you know the area of your IS Planner to study or the task you need to complete.
Computing	Google Classroom	Complete the work for the date you were absent. Have your emails open just in case your teacher needs to give you any further information or tasks to complete.
French & Spanish	Your teacher, by email or in person	Email or speak to your teacher, asking what you need to focus on for your catch-up work.
Art, Drama & Music	Your teacher, by email or in person	Email or speak to your teacher, asking what you need to focus on for your catch-up work.
PE	Extra Curricular	Attend one of the extra-curricular sessions offered by the PE team. This can be either a lunch or an after-school club.
PSHE	Google Classroom	Email or speak to your teacher, asking what you need to focus on for your catch-up work.
