The Curriculum



At Hans Price Academy, we aim to be one of the best schools in the country, renowned for delivering outstanding academic results and developing world-class aspirations in every student, regardless of background or start-point. We have a broad range of subjects to study in KS4 to ensure students give themselves the best opportunities possible for their future.

We work on a one-week timetable, with six 50 minute periods in one day. Some lessons are singles and some doubles of 100 minutes. Here is the breakdown of the number of 50 minute periods Year 7 students have in each subject in one week.

We will be working with you and your Primary school to help you get used to everything about HPA before you officially start in September. If you need some extra help with your learning, coping with social times or with your mental health, the Inclusion Team are here for you. The team is led by the SENCO's and includes Teaching Assistants (TA's), Counsellors, mentors, a Social Emotional Mental Health specialist and the managers of our three bespoke provisions; Engage, Nurture and Quiet Room. We also have a provision that supports our most vulnerable students within Ready to Learn.

March onwards – We will be happy to answer any questions that you might have, and you are also more than welcome to visit the school again or meet with any of us on request. Please email transition@hpa.clf.uk

April, May and June – We will be visiting every child and their Year 6 teacher in primary schools. We will be gaining as much information as we can from them, and you, about academic data, behaviour, likes and dislikes, friendships, extra-curricular interests and personality traits.

For any students with additional educational needs, our SEN team will meet with primary SEN partners to continue your child's support in the best possible way. There will be enhanced transition opportunities for students to visit Hans Price, with key staff from their primary school, to meet with our Academy SEN team.

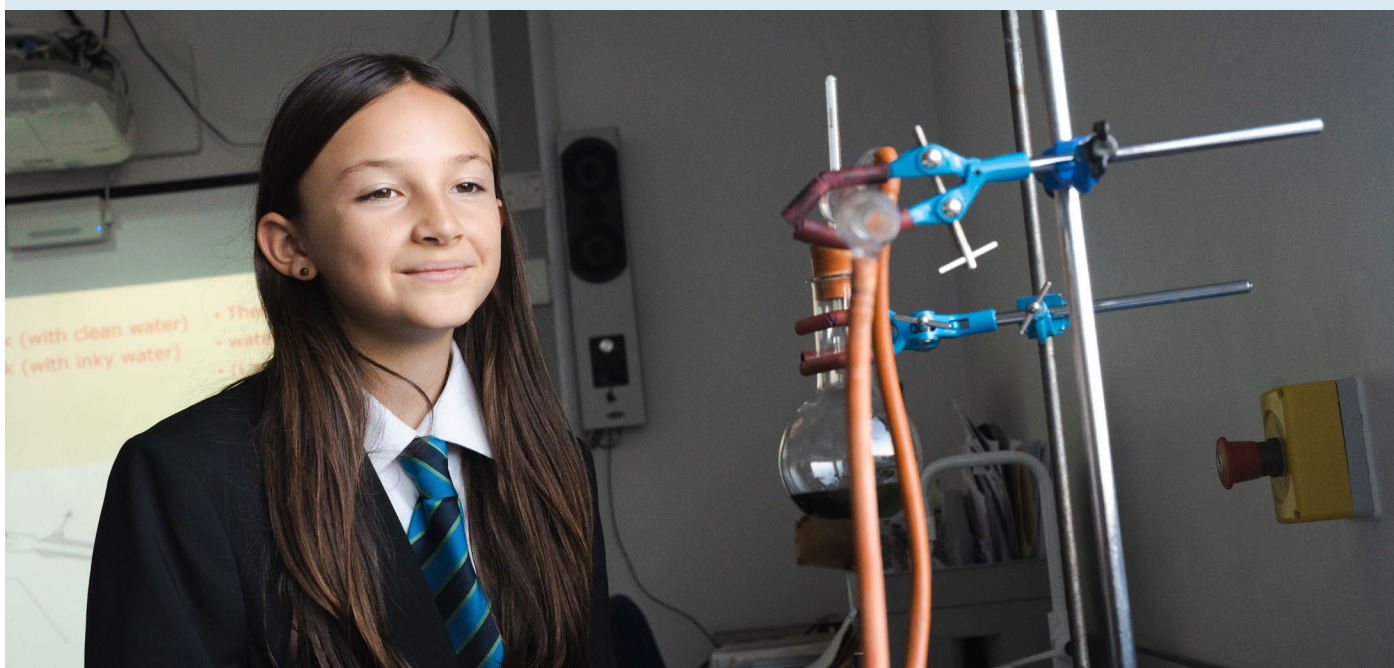
Meanwhile, we will be inviting all students to a movie evening to allow students to meet their new peers and feel more confident being in and around the Academy.
