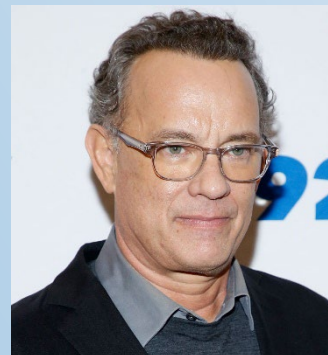

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## ANSWERS

1. **Rapper** – Mark Grist is a rapper and educational worker. He goes into schools across England promoting poetry
2. **Muslim** – Bella Hadid is a famous American model, and also a proud Muslim. She said ‘my dad was a refugee when he first came to America... he was always religious, and he always prayed with us. I am proud to be Muslim’.
3. **Christian** – Tom Hanks was raised Catholic and Mormon, and described himself as a ‘Bible-toting evangelical’ in his teenage years. He still attends church.
4. **Traveller** – Charlie Chaplin was born in a Gypsy caravan in the West Midlands. Both of his parents were Roma, and had Romany ancestry. He was knighted in 1975.
5. **Opera singer** – Noah Stewart is an African-American opera singer. He was the first black musician to top the British classical music charts.
6. **Convicted criminal** – Christopher Tappin is a businessman was convicted for selling weapon parts to Iran between 2005

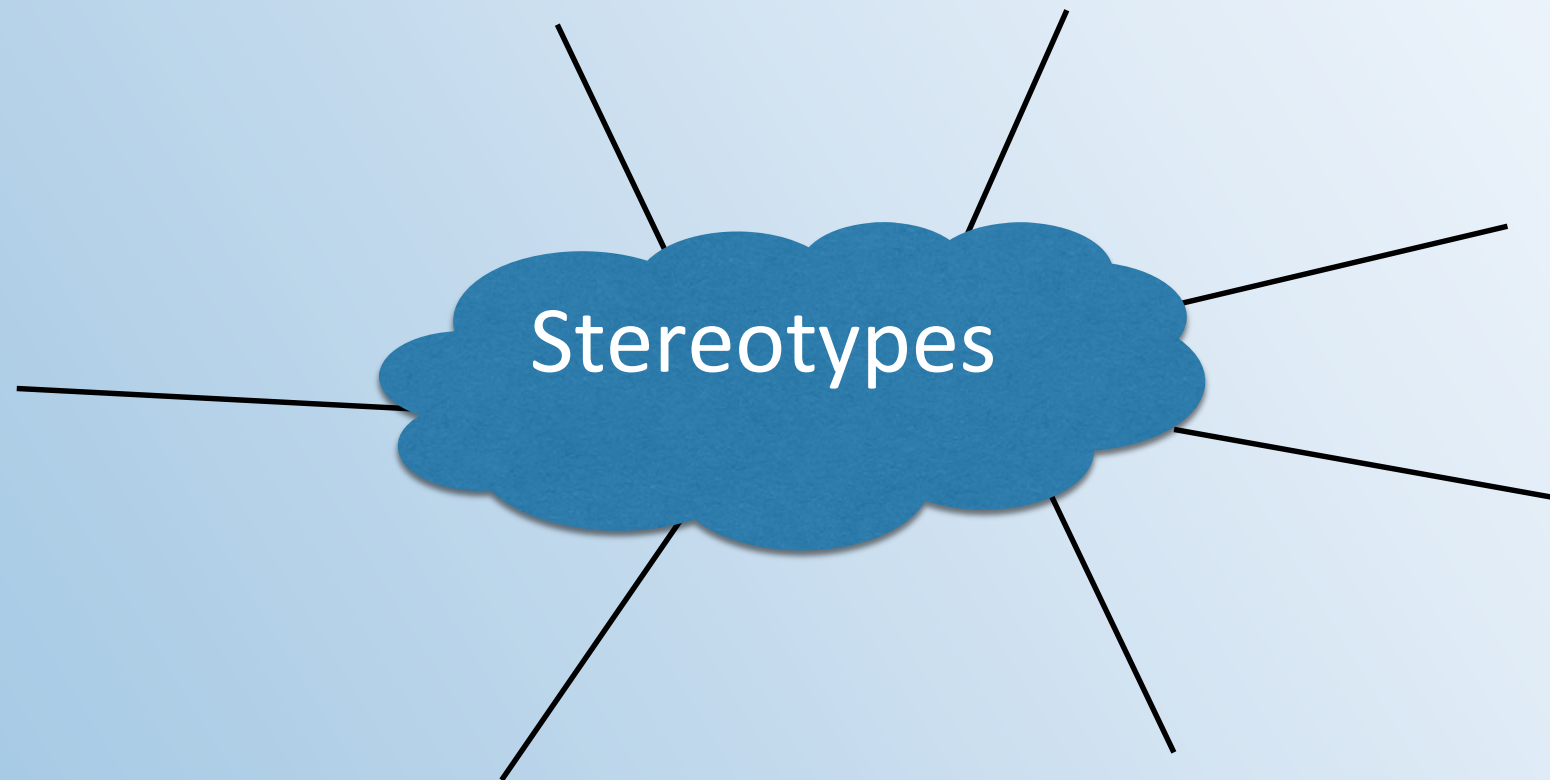

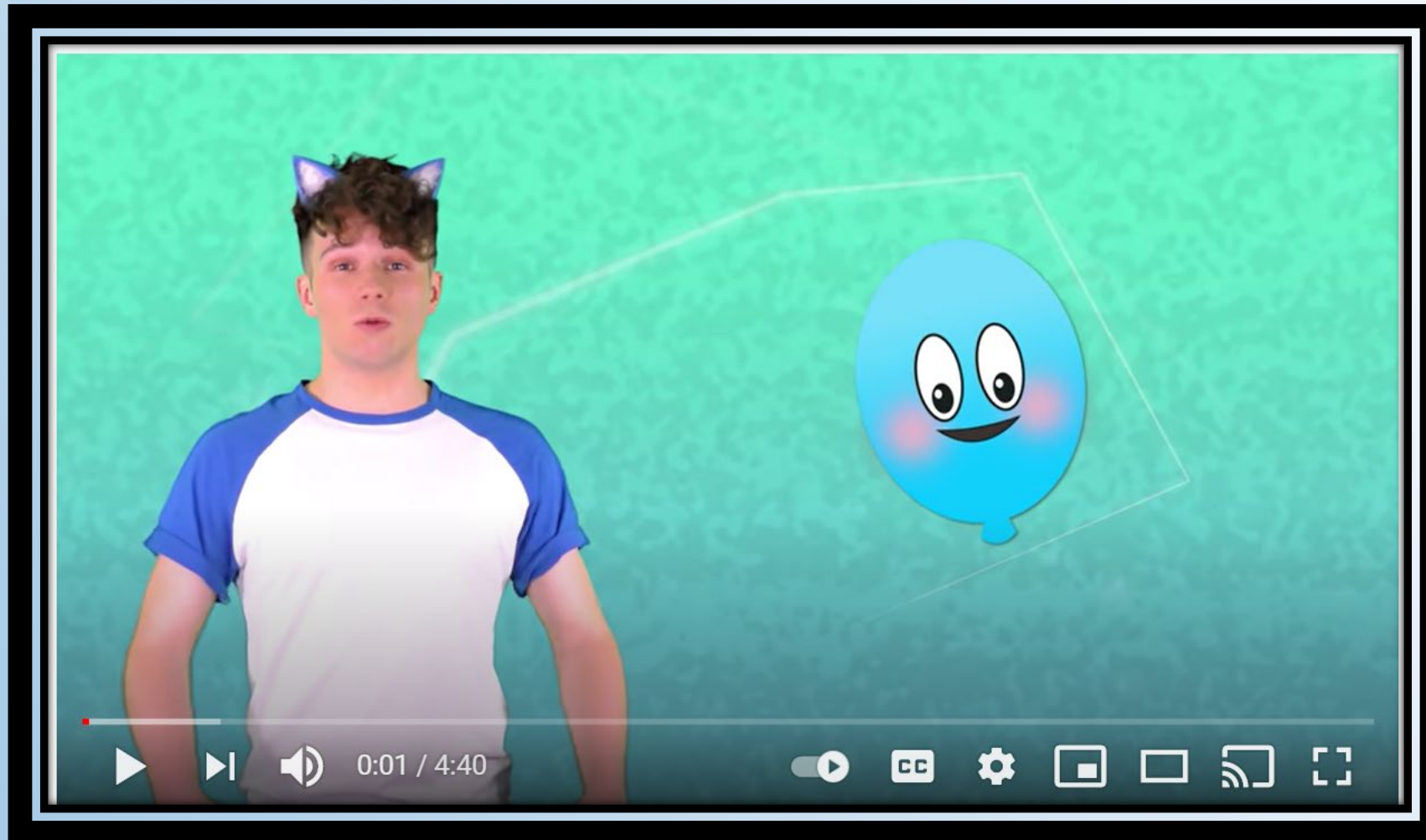
